'LET'S READ' PAGE

The United States of America is run by the president. The current leader of the country is Donald Trump. He lives and works in the White House in Washington D.C. He has many jobs, such as leading the Armed Forces, passing laws, meeting foreign leaders, and making policies. The president can serve two terms. One term is four years, so the most years a president can serve is eight years.

The first president was George Washington. Before he became the president, America was a set of colonies controlled by the king of England. The Constitution was written, which set up the need for a leader. There have been 46 presidents since Washington. Donald Trump is the country's 47th president and is serving his second term.

Do you ever wonder how people become president? To do this, a person must be at least 35 years old, be born in the United States, and have lived in the country for at least 14 years. Then, they have to win the most electoral votes on Election Day. We celebrate the presidents on Presidents' Day, which is the third Monday in February. It is a federal holiday, so government organizations are closed. It is very close to the birthdate of George Washington. It originally honored his birthday but was expanded in 1971.
