As a young girl, Sally Ride was very interested in science. She studied science during her time at Stanford University. After college, she applied and was accepted for a position at NASA. Five years later, she became the first American woman in space aboard the space shuttle Challenger. She also became the youngest American in space. She went back up into space in 1984 on the Challenger again. As she was preparing for her third mission into space, the Challenger exploded. She was put on the committee to figure out what happened. After retiring from NASA, she was honored with many awards, including the NASA Space Flight Medal.

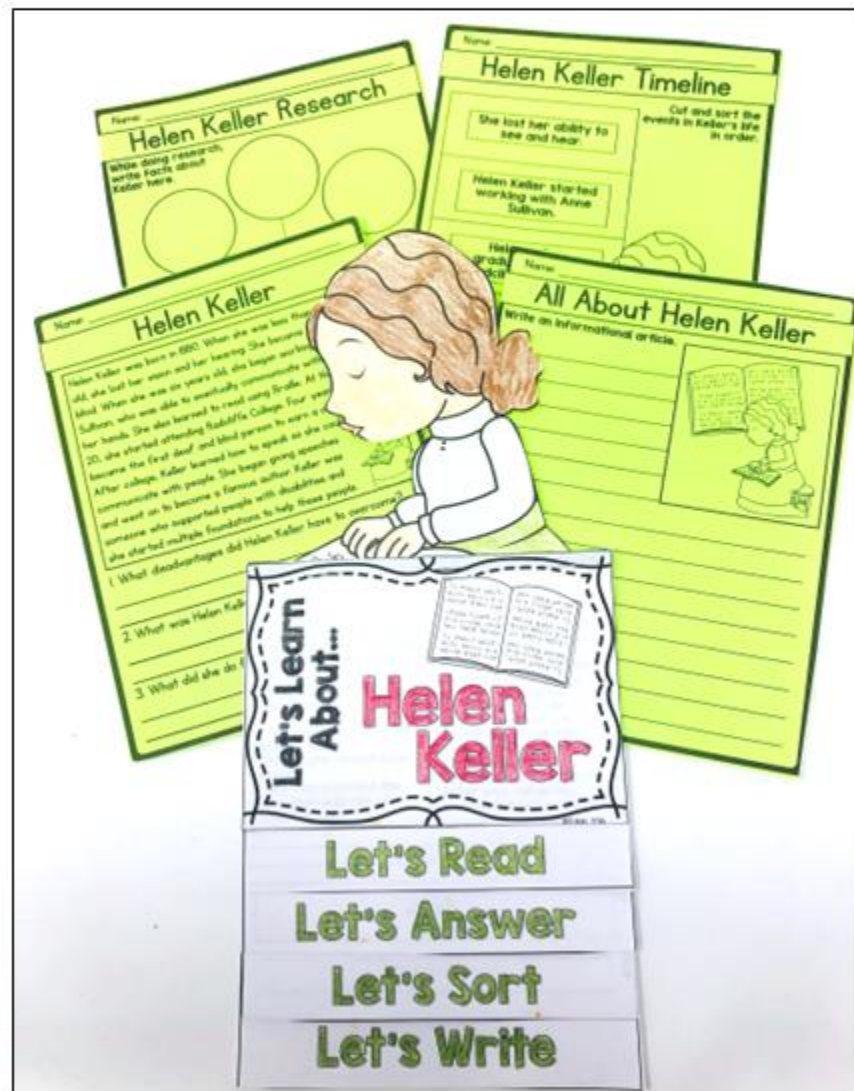

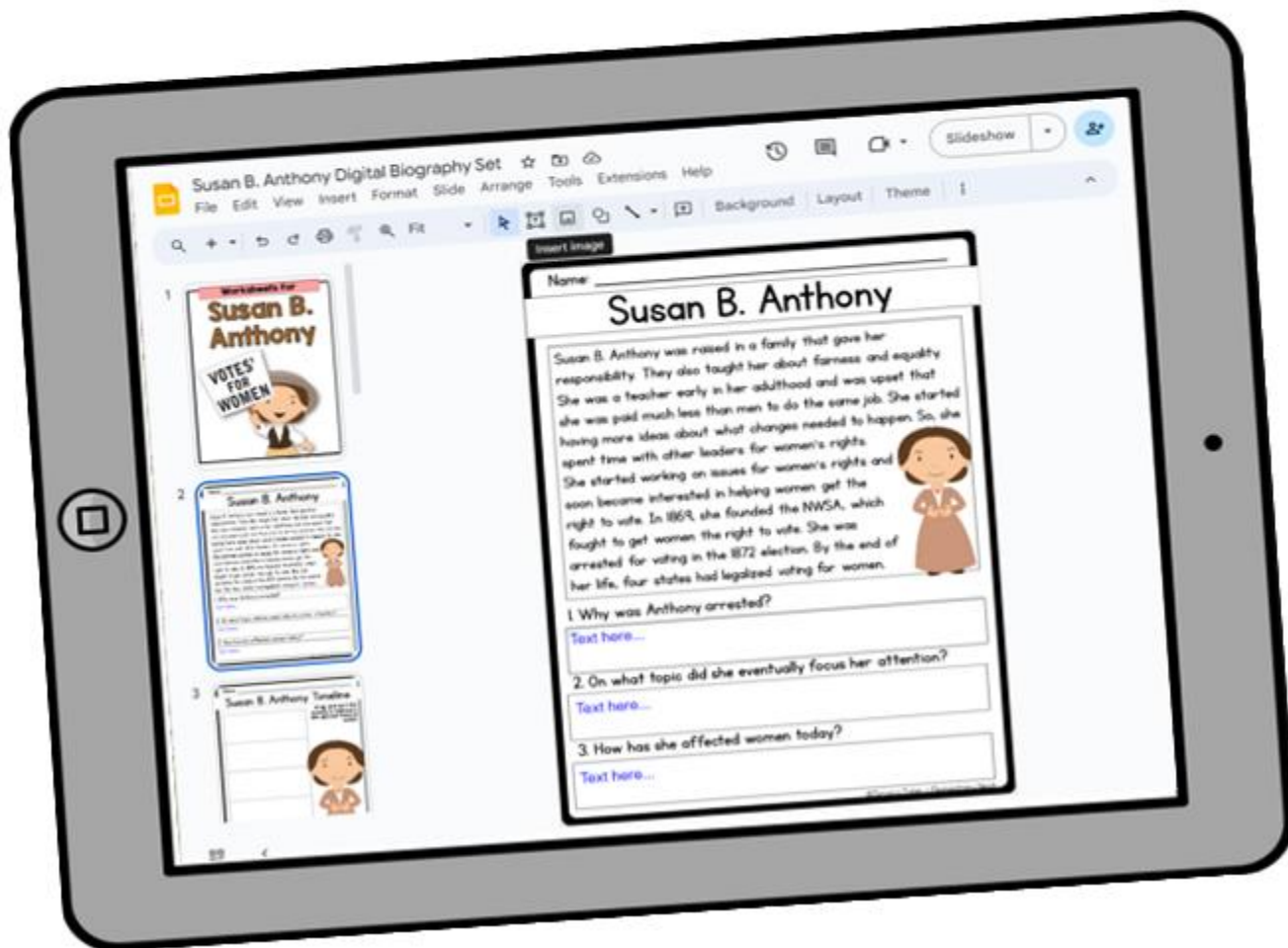
