Winter Reader's Theater

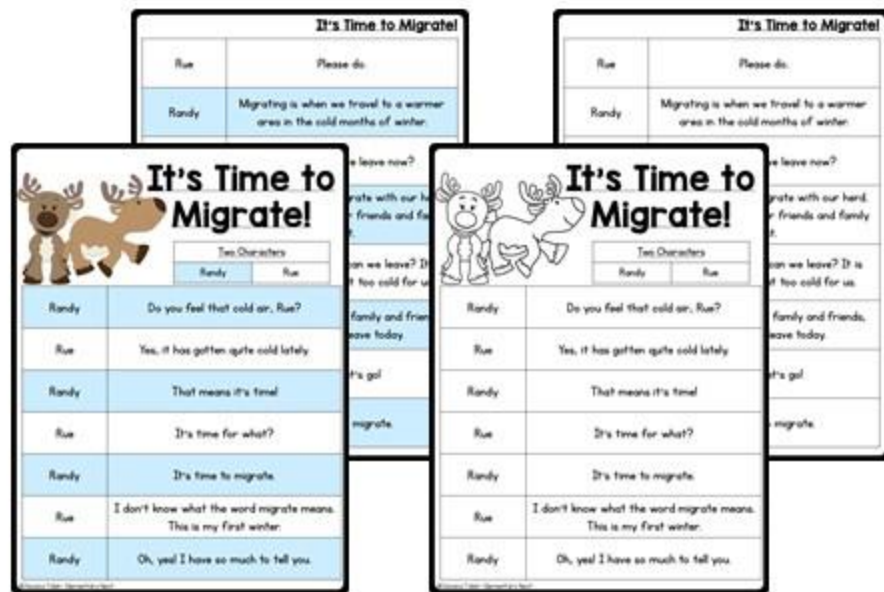

- has black & white copy

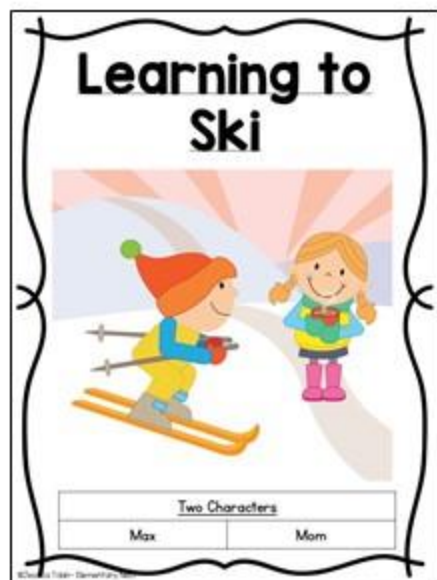

New Year's Eve

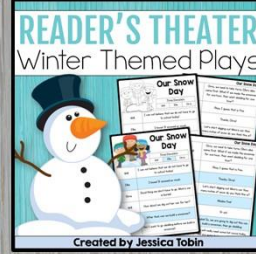
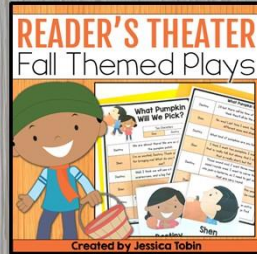
Mom	Things like being healthier or cleaner.
