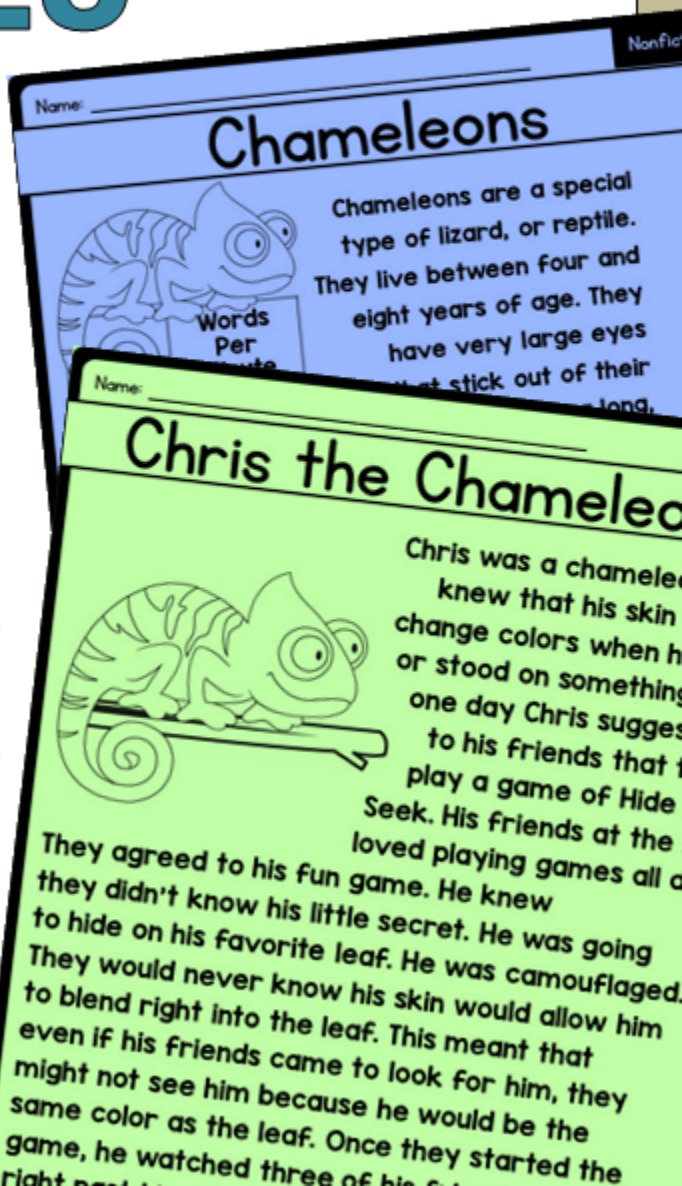


PASSAGES

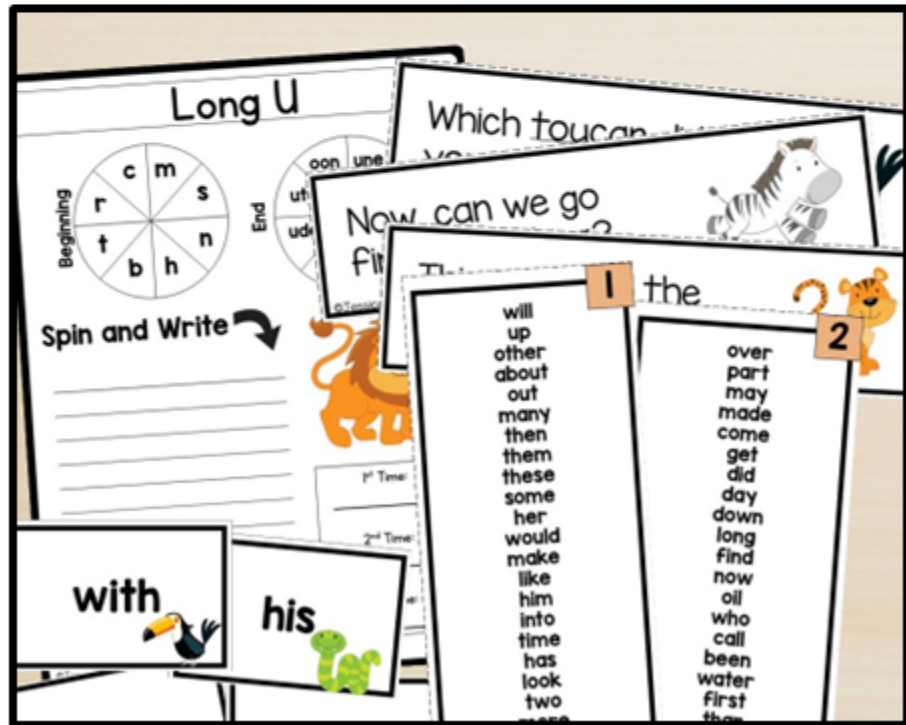
